EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Community safety is a basic human right and an important factor in the quality of life of individuals, families and local communities.

The complex nature of crime demands that it be addressed at a number of levels, with a mixture of short, medium and long term strategies directed at all life stages, from early intervention programs with families to prevent the development of anti-social and criminal behaviour, to assisting vulnerable groups in the community.

It is clear that the responsibility for addressing the means to make our communities safer and prevent crime is beyond the scope of any one agency or sector. Only by working in partnership in a targeted manner can the whole community make a difference to crime and anti-social behaviour.

The Shire of Capel's Community Safety and Crime Prevention Plan has been developed to address crime and safety issues in the localities of Boyanup, Capel, Dalzellup, Gelorup and Peppermint Grove Beach along with the smaller rural settlements across the Shire.

The local crime and safety issues were identified from 2010 Police Statistics, 2010 Neighbourhood Watch minutes, the Shire's 2009 Community Survey and the Shire's 2010 record of vandalism and graffiti reported to the State Graffiti Hotline. Strategies to address these crime and safety concerns were developed during a workshop that was attended by State Government agencies, Shire of Capel officers, local school chaplains, the Police, Satterley Property Group and representatives from the community including the President of Capel Fuzion (Youth Centre in Capel).

The Plan is set in the context of a three year implementation period with a view of reducing crime and improving levels of community safety by 2014.
