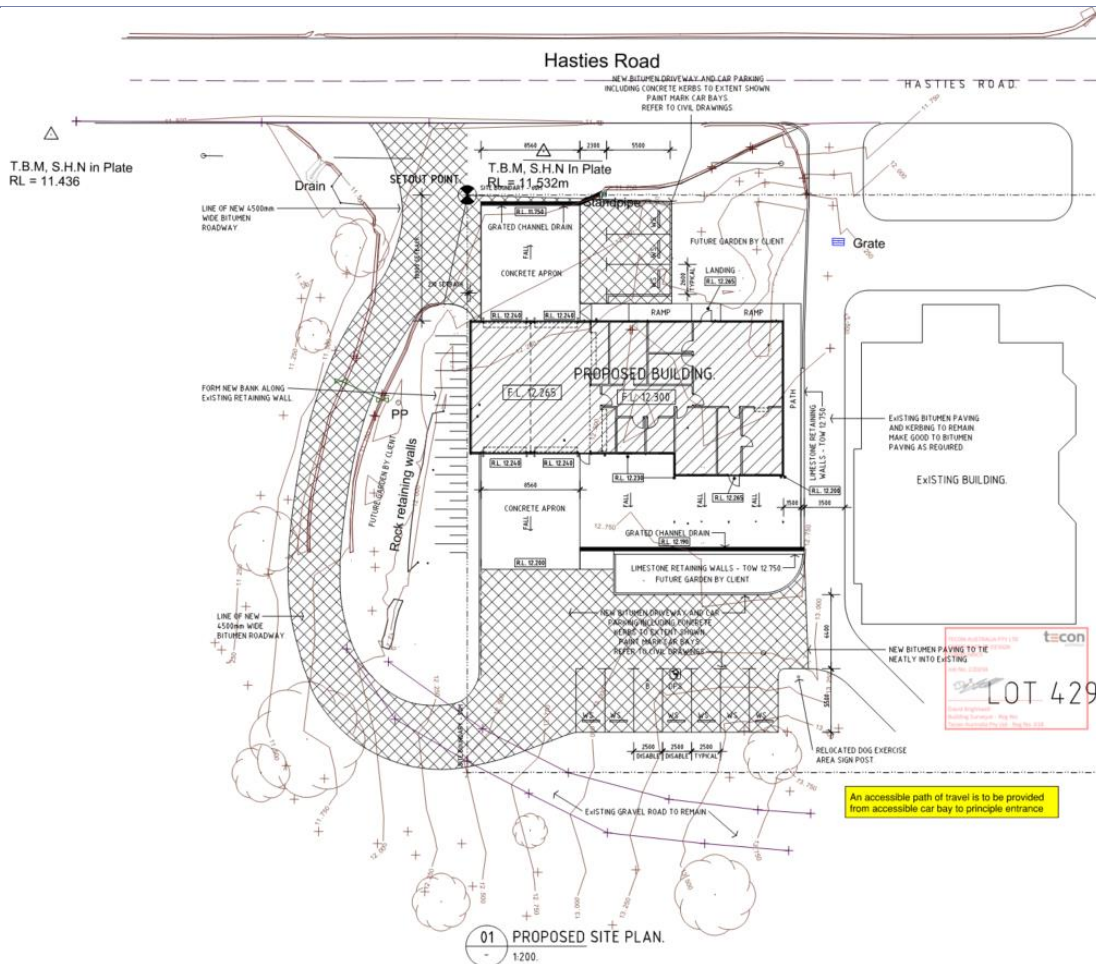

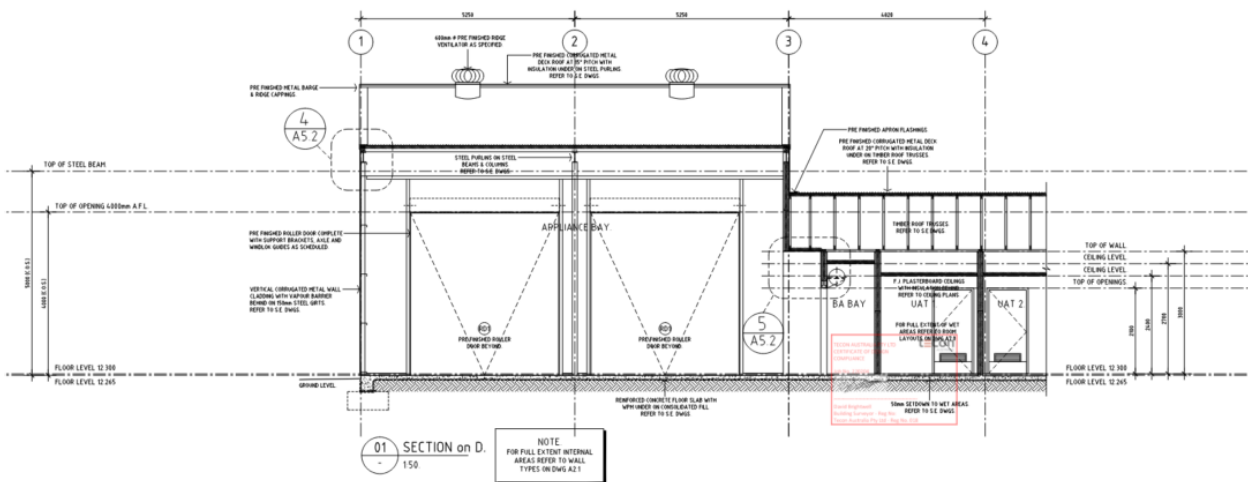

Project Brief:

The original Request for Tender (RFT 22-14 Gelorup VBFB Building Construction) had a scope of works statement listed as follows:

- AS 2124 Construction contract. Construction of a new Volunteer Bushfire Brigade building on Hasties Road, in Gelorup WA.
- The existing shed structure on the site will be demolished prior to site possession however the slab and footings of the shed will remain for removal under the building contract.
- Construction will be slab on ground with FC clad framed construction for the administrative portion of the building and structural steel framed, Colorbond clad construction for the Appliance Bays.
- Completion of surrounding driveways and carparking works and associated drainage and new septic system all in the prescribed timeframe.
- A full statement of the goods/services required under the proposed contract appears in the Specifications and drawings.

The detail design and specification of this project was delivered by H & H Architects Pty Ltd, a regionally local Bunbury design consultancy firm.

H & H Architects and the Shire Projects Manager are the key stakeholders performing contract oversight and superintendence of this project through the construction phase.

The project is anticipated to be **completed in September 2023**, this pending weather and contractor and supplier availability and conformance to commitments.
